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side, it is almost impossible to write a bad set of behavioral learning outcomes! Common mistakes . Verbs such as “know” and “understand” are vague. Avoid these words and use action verbs from the list provided.

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Bloom's Taxonomy of
Measurable Verbs

Benjamin Bloom created a taxonomy of measurable verbs to help us describe and classify observable knowledge, skills, attitudes, behaviors and abilities. The theory is

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Outcome
based upon the idea that
there are levels of
observable actions that
indicate something is
happening in the brain
(cognitive activity.)

Good learning outcomes
focus on the application

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Student Learning

and integration of the
knowledge and skills
acquired in a particular
unit of instruction (e.g.
activity, course program,
etc.), and emerge from a
process of reflection on
the essential contents of a
course. More specifically,

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good learning outcomes:
Are very specific, and use
