Brickmaking at Little Cornard The basic clay for both Red and White bricks was dug in the winter. It contained a high proportion of flint, necessitating a thorough washing before the resultant slurry was run into ponds known as wash pits. In the spring the clay was dug out again to be used for brickmaking.

PREFACE: There are three processes used in making bricks, varying primarily in the amount of water mixed with the clay. 3 STIFF-MUD/EXTRUDED: In this process, used for most building bricks, only enough water is added to the clay to make it into a stiff paste that can be extruded through a die into a long ribbon or column of clay.
