argument. Since most of these paper assignments are short, it is important to be concise in all parts of your analysis. Writing an outline (and following it) is crucial to remain focused on your argument and avoid

Writing a critical paper requires two steps: critical reading and critical writing. Critical reading: 1. Identify the author's thesis and purpose 2. Analyze the structure of the passage by identifying all main ideas 3. Consult a dictionary or encyclopedia to understand material that is unfamiliar to you 4. Make an outline of the work or write a description of it 5. Write a summary of the work 6.

This handout guides you through the six steps for writing a Critical Essay. Step 1. Organizing your Thoughts (Brainstorming) Step 2. Researching your Topic Step 3. Developing a Thesis Statement Step 4. Writing the Introduction Step 5. Writing the Body of the Essay Step 6. Writing the Conclusion

In writing a critical analysis, you will be presenting, in around four pages, a detailed account of the passage in question, in terms of context, content, and form. Given the amount of textual detail you will be dealing with, you will need to present your findings in an

Critical Analysis Template In a critical analysis essay, you systematically evaluate a work's effectiveness including what it does well and what it does poorly. It can be used to discuss a book, article or even a film. You must read the piece carefully and may need to look up terms or concepts you are unfamiliar with or

A critical review or analysis is characterised by two main types of writing: (i) writing descriptively to summarise the particular arguments or concepts of a text, and (ii) writing critically in order to evaluate and/or analyse these arguments and concepts.
