The sole minor key Piano Sonatas K. 310 and K. 457 by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart almost always elicit the same adjectives: dark, potent, despairing, tragic, austere, fatalistic, and implacable. 1. The Piano Sonata in A Minor, K. 310, was composed in 1778 (probably in Paris) and first published in 1781, and the Piano Sonata in C Minor, K. 457, was composed in Vienna in 1784

Examples: Beethoven's piano sonata in E-flat major op. 7, first movement; Beethoven's ninth symphony, first movement; Mozart's piano sonata in c-minor K. 457, first movement (I think); Brahms' third symphony, first movement. (This is sort of a "cop-out" analysis: If I can't understand it, it must be prolongation of the tonic.)
