We build a positive theory of parenting that accounts for broad changes in parenting styles in industrialized countries over time,

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and for variation in parenting styles across countries. In our model, parents are driven by a combination of Beckerian altruism (i.e., a concern for the well-being of the child) and a paternalistic motive.

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**Parenting styles** Parenting style refers to parenting behaviors which affect the child's emotion and behavior (1). The effects of different forms of parenting may be influenced by heredity, culture and characteristics of the child (14). Baumrind (1967) identified three main parenting styles based on their demanding nature.

Authoritative

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Early literature tends to look at parenting styles from a multitude of nuances and sub-areas, while culture and ethnicity MAJOR PAPER 4 always seems to be buried within other factors. More recent research (since 2000) has taken a closer look at “varying aspects of culture for their explanations (Doe, 2000; Whaley, 2000; Xu et al., 2000)” (Giles-Sims & Lockhart, 2005, pg. 197).

This research aimed to investigate the relationship between parenting styles and coping capability among Malaysian adolescents. going children and that parenting style will impact the preschool aggressive behaviors. The participants included 310 school going children and their parents. The aggressive behavior was measured by CBCL 1.5-5 (Rescorla, 2005) and parenting styles by Parenting Styles and Dimensions Questionnaire (Robinson, Mandelco, Olsen, & Hart, 2001).

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Through naturalistic observation, parenting interviews, and other research methods, Baumrind identified the following four parenting styles: \* Authoritative: democratic style of parenting, parents are

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attentive, forgiving, teach their offspring proper behavior, have a set of rules, and if child fails to follow their is punishment, if followed their is reward/reinforcement
