2/4/2015 · As a starter rule, open your lens to it's widest aperture, set your ISO to about 1600 and shoot an exposure of 10-15 seconds. Aurora activity, even bright strong activity is still quite dark to the camera sensor; so even at high ISO, you need a relatively long exposure of about 10-15

Your camera will need to remain completely still for anywhere between 5 and 30 seconds, potentially even minutes if you choose, and most places that provide opportunities for northern lights photography also tend to have challenging wind and weather.

14/11/2017 · Dial-in your ISO to 800 - If the lights aren't clear enough then up your ISO, but too much and you'll get graininess. Try a 15-second exposure - up your exposure time if the Northern Lights are being shy. You'll have more time to capture
