Writing frames provide scaffold for writing. Steps: 1. When teaching writing using a frame, first introduce the type of writing with the critical elements highlighted. 2. Present the writing frame and model how to complete it. 3. Discuss the writing frame responses with the class and invite students ...

researcher Donald Graves suggests that elementary grade teachers should spend at least 35-40 minutes on daily writing instruction and related student writing activities starting in first grade. As writing demands become more complex, the amount of time for writing should increase.

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Using a frame or web graphic organizer (see figures), the teacher elicits details for each of the five senses as they pertain to the student experiences. The framing organizer (Ellis, 2000) offers several different formats for framing information, which can be modified for different grade levels or ability levels within a classroom.

In short, I want what students learn about writing to add up to more than the sum of their parts. I don't want students to have a bunch of writing information or techniques; I want students to have writing skill. Here is what I hope it adds up to: Daily writing – I want students to have pride of authorship in every single piece of writing.

Students are to "quick write" (write whatever comes to mind about the topic, without regards to written conventions—a brainstorming on paper) for a limited amount of time. Begin with short time periods 1-2 minutes, because students must write the entire time. Cloze Activity This can be a highly scaffolded writing, where students are given key
